Your actions can make a huge difference in the life of a vulnerable cat, and we're here to help you navigate the steps to ensure their safety.



IDENTIFY IF STRAY OR FERAL

Stray cats may be frightened, but are familiar with human interaction, & usually found around residential areas. Feral cats are born in the wild, are less accustomed to humans & will act more defensively. They also tend to appear well-fed and groomed.



TRY TO APPROACH THE STRAY CAT

Approach with care; extend a gentle hand, use a calm voice, & offer dry food and water to encourage trust. Avoid wet food initially due to potential allergens and leave dry food out to gain their trust.



APPLY A PAPER COLLAR

Make a paper collar by fastening a strip of paper to the collar with your contact details, Alternatively you can print a premade one here: https://bit.ly/catsprotectionpapercollar



TAKE A PICTURE & POST ON SOCIAL MEDIA

Create a social media post to share and post in all local groups.



MAKE LOCAL ANIMAL CHARITIES AWARE

Contact your local animal charities & give the cats details to make • them aware.



TAKE TO THE VETS TO BE SCANNED FOR A MICROCHIP

If no owner has been found after 7 days, take to a vet for them to contact the owner if the cat is microchipped.



DISPLAY POSTERS & CONTACT NEIGHBOURS

Try any way possible to contact people in your local area. Door knocking and displaying posters are great ideas.
